EYES:

May cause mouth, throat and stomach irritation. Symptoms may include nausea, vomiting and diarrhea.

4. FIRST AID MEASURES

EYES:

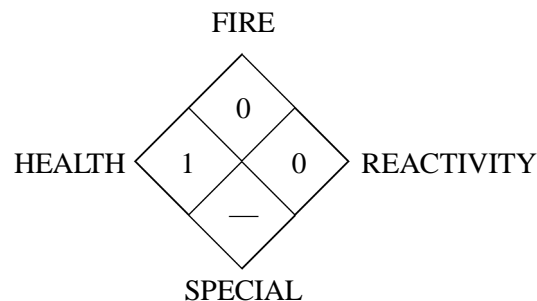
