## 3. HAZARDS IDENTIFICATION

#### **EMERGENCY OVERVIEW**

#### **EFFECTS OF ACUTE EXPOSURE**

EYES:

May cause eye irritation. Symptoms may include redness and pain.

#### SKIN:

May cause mild skin irritation. Symptoms may include redness. Organisms used in this product are non-pathogenic, but can cause infection when in contact with open wounds.

## INHALATION:

High concentrations of vapor or mist may cause nose, throat and respiratory tract irritation. Symptoms may include coughing. High concentrations of vapor or mist may also cause central nervous system effects including headache, dizziness and nausea.

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#### INGESTION:

May cause mouth, throat and stomach irritation. Symptoms may include nausea, vomiting and diarrhea. May also cause central nervous system effects including headache, dizziness and weakness.

Prolonged or repeated contact may cause skin irritation.

## 4. FIRST AID MEASURES

#### EYES:

Flush eyes with plenty of water while holding eyelids apart. After initial flushing, remove any contact lenses and continue flushing for at least 15 minutes. Do not put any medication in the victim's eyes unless instructed by a physician. Get medical attention.

#### SKIN:

Flush with water, then wash with soap and water. Remove saturated clothing. Get medical attention if irritation develops or open wounds are present.

#### INHALATION:

Remove to fresh air. If not breathing, give respiration; if breathing is difficult, give oxygen (by trained personnel only). Get medical attention if symptoms persist.


